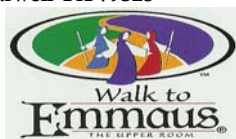

## A note from our Spiritual Director

Greetings to the Saints of New Horizons Community:

At this time of year, the world celebrates a holiday, for many as only a day off from work. Many enjoy their annual pilgrimage to the church to see if anything has changed since last year. But we, who believe, celebrate the death and resurrection of our Savior, the Lord Jesus. Many people have more cause to celebrate more this year, because they got to see the bones of Jesus on television. This lends support to their basic position that the resurrection never occurred.

The resurrection is difficult to accept. It goes against what we see, hear, and feel. **John 20:1-8** relates a story that always strikes me. Mary Magdalene found the empty tomb and ran to tell the apostles. Peter and John ran to the tomb. John arrived first and apparently was afraid, so he did not enter. V8 says that the other disciple (John) followed Peter in and "he saw and he believed". The question is what did he see and why did he believe. If you put something somewhere and it is not there, what do you think? Someone moved it, of course, as stated in v 2 by Mary Magdalene. Objects don't move! Books, hammers, car keys etc. stay in place until moved by someone. Jesus was not there! Someone must have moved Him!

John suddenly believed that Jesus had risen. He had walked with and listened to Him for a long time, but now John understood that Jesus had raised the temple in 3 days! What did he see? The grave clothes were there. They had not been moved with the body. Think about it. If you were a Roman soldier and moved the body, why would you unwrap a dead criminal? You would not! If you were a palace guard for the Sanhedrin, a Sanhedrin member, or just a Jew you would not touch a dead body, because of the prohibition against uncleanness! You might steal the body, but would not leave the grave wrappings.

John saw the empty wrappings and the folded face cloth and he knew. My Lord has risen! Hallelujah!
