A note from our Spiritual Director

Greetings to the Saints of New Horizons Community:

The Joy of Finding a Lost Thing.

I must confess that I lose things. Things like keys, hammers, and other tools. Take a hammer for example. I will be building something and my hammer will disappear. Right from under my nose. I try to go over in my mind where I have been since I last used it. I go back to each of those places and it is not there. When I ask Sandy for help, she says nasty things to me. Like: it is right there on the sawhorse where you left it. It can't be, I have looked there 3 times! But, it is: right there in plain sight! Or car keys. You know they have a way of hiding. I will look in the drawer, where they are to be; in the pants I took off; and then I go to the car. Not in the ignition, or floor, or under the seat. Back to the house and get Sandy to help. They are in the drawer where I have looked 2 times! They can't be, but they are.

The urgency with which I look for the keys is proportional to the time I have before I will be late. As time gets short, the urgency increases and I seek them more frantically.

Have you noticed that no one celebrates when the keys are where they belong! If I had found them in the key drawer, would I have shouted for joy? Certainly not. I would have put them in my pocket and left for work. But since they were lost and I had become frantic, I shouted for joy. Well, maybe only a little shout. But, in my mind, I would celebrate. The more urgently I sought, the louder the celebration!

Jesus understood the celebration with finding a lost item. While we celebrate a found key, Jesus said heaven celebrates whenever a lost soul is found. The angels jump and shout! Do they hug each other and do the high-five? Maybe not, but we know they celebrate! Heaven has watched for years as God uses ordinary people to seek and reach the lost. That is His stated purpose; to keep all from perishing.

Why do we not have a sense of urgency about the lost soul? Do we not see the value of every person? A sense of guilt overcomes me when I realize how little I seek and pray for lost persons, especially those I love. So to deal with this, I resolve once more to seek the Lord's face about those I love, who I suspect are lost. Remember a small word about Him, can be the seed that grows into a tree! ^{Matthew 13:31-32} Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field: ³² Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof.¹

OH Lord! Help me to realize the worth of every person and make me sense the urgency to get out of the way and let you reach them through me! Help me to remember that a small word from me, about You, can be like a mustard seed. It can grow!
