On Friday and Saturday the disciples thought everything was lost, but on that Easter morning when they found the tomb empty, what a difference it made, and still makes in the lives of those who believe that we serve a RISEN Savior. Amen!  
Well I received this story in an email and thought I would share it.

It seems there were some dinner guests sitting around the table discussing life. One man, a CEO, decided to explain the problem with education. He argued, 'What's a kid going to learn from someone who decided their best option in life was to become a teacher?'
