A Note from Our Community Spiritual Director

Jody and I just returned from a 5000 mile 3.5 week trip to Florida up to DC and back by way of Kansas City. It was awesome. We experienced beaches and historical sites that I've never seen. The sweetest part was visiting and reconnecting with family and friends, some who I had not seen in over three decades and Jody had not gotten to meet before. Memories were made...precious memories.

We spent some days in Williamsburg where we saw Jamestown and Yorktown, the battlefield that saw the end of the Revolutionary War, giving birth to the nation we now enjoy. We passed by several Civil War battlefields in Virginia on our way to DC. In Washington, we toured many of the same war and presidential memorials that my dad had seen in October on the first South Plains Honor Flight. We also perused some Smithsonian museums including the Air and Space, National History, and National Holocaust Museums.

All these sights, and sometimes sounds, evoked feelings and instilled memories of our heritage as a nation and the cost of acquiring and maintaining a high quality of freedom. At the WW2 Memorial, we thought with pride about our fathers who served to prevent the evil of tyranny and injustice. We viewed with sober reflection the complicity that cause Jews to be displaced, imprisoned, and murdered as less than human. We scaped with some shame our own nation's policy of enslaving people of color and treating them less than human even after emancipation.

At the Korean War Memorial, we saw inscribed in granite, "Freedom Isn't Free." At the Vietnam War Memorial, while scanning the thousands of names of those who gave their lives in that unpopular conflict, my eyes caught the name, JIMMY A AWALT, one of several classmates who were killed in 1968, a year after graduation, still teenagers. I took a very sobering photo and posted it on our PHS Facebook page. Freedom isn't free.

We toured the WW1 Memorial in Kansas City on Memorial Day while visiting our cousins, Dennis and Linda. We also celebrated our thirteenth anniversary that day. Again, on the day we set aside to remember sacrifices made for us and this world, we saw a remarkable archive that chronicled the horror of the "War to End All Wars." It, unfortunately, didn't. It was a world where the privilege and control of aristocracy was at odds with the so-called "masses" of workers in an industrial revolution, especially in Europe. The death and destruction of millions was sparked by the killing of Ferdinand, Archduke of Austria by a Serbian assassin, who hadn't gotten word that it had been called off by colleagues. The memorializing, with gratitude, of those who sacrificed also sadly reminds us of the gross evil of war. One can cause unspeakable harm to millions.

Paul writes to the Corinthians in the fifteenth chapter of his first letter that through the one man came death. But through the second Adam, came resurrection and life. In the midst of memorializing, we understand that we are yet at war, not just with flesh and blood, but especially with the spiritual forces of the Evil One.

Each time we partake of the bread and wine, the body and blood of Christ reminds us that the enemy that continues to battle us has been defeated at the cross of Calvary and that we are equipped to do battle victoriously. Each time we commune with God we remember the sacrifice paid for our freedom...from sin...from death. And we are grateful, Lord. Because the grace and freedom we enjoy isn't free.
