## A Word from Guy & Kelly

M Kings 16:30-32, "Now Ahab the son of Omri did evil in the sight of the Lord, more than all who were before him. And it came to pass, as though it had been a trivial thing for him to walk in the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, that he took as wife Jezebel the daughter of Ethbaal, king of the Sidonians; and he went and served Baal and worshiped him. Then he set up an altar for Baal in the temple of Baal, which he had built in Samaria."

Ahab was the most despicable King in the history of Israel, but as if his worship of Baal wasn't bad enough, he built him a Temple and built an altar in it to make sacrifices to him. In fact, a cursory examination of the history of the Israelites reveals a pattern.

The worship of idols, in violation of the first and perhaps most important Commandment of the "Big" Ten, "You shall have no other gods before ME", was their greatest problem. Idolatry causes Israel to be cast off the Land of their inheritance, and to serve other nations who definitely do not have their best interest at heart. How could they be so foolish after all that God had done for them?

Thank goodness idolatry is not a modern-day problem! Well perhaps we need to examine the subject a little closer. The definition of idolatry is essentially putting something above God in order of importance. Which of course, shows up in the way in which we live our lives. The two greatest American Idols are Sports (allows us to live our lives vicariously through our hero athletes) and education (we no longer see the deepening of our knowledge of God as a means to a successful life, but instead we see education levels as the key to success). Both of these things are essentially "good" and not evil, but Americans have made them evil by promoting them to a place in their lives which is higher than God.

I'm struck by the powerful lesson we learn from the "Counsel of Balaam", who advised Balak, the king of Moab on how to overcome the impending destruction that was coming his way at the hands of the massive Israelite Army which was about to swarm over him. It was to allow the Moabite women to consort with the Israelite men, but the resulting sexual sin was not the "killer". It was the fact that the women would entice the Israelites to worship Baal of Peor, and that would lead to there destruction. How? It would cause their total rejection by God and the complete loss of His anointing.

So, when we look around today, and see a fentanyl overdose epidemic, violence in our cities, thieves smashing jewelry cases in broad daylight, and hopelessness and suicide among our young people, just know that these things are the effects of generational Idolatry. America cannot be great again, until Jesus becomes great again in our culture. When Jesus reigns supreme over America, idolatry and its disastrous effects will be cleansed from our culture. Politics in and of itself, cannot make America Great Again!

Only Revival can do this! This is our mission and our cause! Go out to the hurting and helpless and give 'em Jesus! It's the only strategy that will save America! A Great Awakening is at hand!
